Travelling to Lund

Lund is a small city (around 100.000 inhabitants) situated in the south western part of Sweden, 20 kilometers north of Malmoe, the third biggest town in Sweden, and about 60 kilometers from Copenhagen in Denmark; there is a bridge between Sweden and Denmark from Copenhagen to a place just south of Malmoe.

By plane

There are two airports in the Lund area, Malmoe-Sturup which is 30 kilometers from Lund, and Copenhagen-Kastrup, which is 70 kilometers from Lund. Malmoe-Sturup is mostly a domestic and charter airport, although there are occasional international connections, e.g. with Ryan Air. There is a bus connection from Sturup to Lund. Copenhagen-Kastrup is the international airport in the region. Every 20 minute there is a train going to or from Malmoe, and most of these trains go to Lund as well; it takes around one hour to get from Kastrup to Lund by train.

By train

If you go by train, you will very probably have to go to Copenhagen and take the connection to Malmoe/Lund from there. Kastrup is one of the stations on the Danish side on the railway from Copenhagen to Malmoe/Lund. There are train connections from Stockholm and Gothenburg to Lund as well.

By boat

You can reach southern Sweden by boat either from Germany (Sasnitz – Trelleborg or Travemünde-Trelleborg), or from Swinoujscie in Poland to Ystad. Both from Ystad and Trelleborg there are train connections with Malmoe/Lund.

By car

Either you take one of the ferries (see above), or you drive to Copenhagen and from there to Malmoe/Lund.
